Since 1989, the Chesterfield Education Foundation (CEF) has partnered with Chesterfield County Public Schools (CCPS) to ensure its educators and more than 64,000 students have access to resources and opportunities necessary for successful teaching and learning. School and division needs have long exceeded available tax dollars, and parent-led fundraisers can perpetuate economic inequality. As a result of our work and through the generosity of donors, hundreds of thousands of philanthropic dollars reach classrooms every year, impacting student outcomes and educator engagement throughout the county.

Our overarching goal in everything we pilot, scale, or make possible through fundraising is to give every student and educator in our public schools the tools and supportive environment they need to thrive. The past few years have shown us that we cannot take their wellbeing for granted. Through collaboration with the YMCA, Communities In Schools - Chesterfield, CCPS Family & Community Engagement, Read to Them, community members, and others CEF can continue to make a lasting difference in the lives of Chesterfield's young people.

CEF operates with the core pillars of Equity, Opportunity, and Community - underscored by a vision of excellence and wellbeing in every school, regardless of zip code. Every child deserves a world-class education. To that end, CEF raises money and invests it back into core programs: Innovation Grants for teachers, scholarships for graduating seniors, literacy initiatives in every school, the Mirror Me teacher diversity program, Career & Technical Education expansion, wraparound supports for the Chesterfield Recovery Academy and other students dealing with trauma, and access to early childhood education at Chester Early Childhood Learning Academy (CECLA). We are removing barriers and equipping more students and teachers with what they need to succeed.

Thank you to all the donors, sponsors, and volunteers who support this work. Most of CEF's efforts take place behind the scenes: delivering lunches to school staff, providing books for children to take home, awarding classroom mini-grants to teachers, and covering expenses for field trips when students might otherwise be left out. CEF does things like this every week because we know that every child deserves access to a world-class education, and every teacher deserves to be supported in making that happen.

READING AND GROWING







LITERACY PROGRAM GROWTH

This year, the Chesterfield Education Foundation supported over 43 schools, to expand literacy programs across the district. Every elementary school received \$2,000 to enhance their literacy initiatives, ensuring students have access to engaging and diverse reading materials. Additionally, targeted support included \$6,000 to Salem Church Middle School for a new book vending machine, designed to reward students with books and encourage independent reading. Elizabeth Scott Elementary School was awarded \$4,000 to expand their bilingual classrooms, fostering a love for reading in Spanish and English. In July 2024, we co-hosted El Librotazo, a community event that provided free books in multiple languages to over 2,000 families, celebrating the joy of reading and supporting multilingual learners.

CCPS EARLY EDUCATION SUPPORT

The Chesterfield Education Foundation proudly supported **376 students** at CECLA, helping them exceed state standards for Kindergarten readiness through targeted initiatives and resources. To ensure all young learners had the tools to succeed, we provided backpacks and kindergarten supplies to the **340 students**, moving on to kindergarten and promoting readiness. Additionally, we funded the installation of sunshades on the playgrounds at CECLA, creating a safe and inclusive space where children of all physical abilities can play and thrive. These efforts reflect our commitment to fostering early childhood development and creating accessible, enriching environments for all students.

INNOVATION GRANTS

This year, the Chesterfield Education Foundation awarded 15 Innovation Grants, totaling \$57,057, to educators at 13 schools, fostering creativity and impactful learning experiences in classrooms across the district. These grants supported initiatives in literacy, math, art therapy, music, STEAM, special education, leadership, and more, reflecting our commitment to addressing diverse educational needs. Additionally, we continued our support for M.A.D.E. and Communities in Schools, empowering students with the tools and resources they need to succeed academically and personally. Through these efforts, we are driving innovation and creating opportunities for all learners.



MAKING AN IMPACT

M.A.D.E PROGRAM

The Chesterfield Education Foundation provided \$20,000 in annual funding to supplement the coordinator's budget for M.A.D.E. (Meadowbrook Academy for Developing Entrepreneurs), ensuring the program's continued success. This support covers DECA membership dues, professional development opportunities, field trips, student conferences, and retail kiosks for selling M.A.D.E. goods, among other program needs. By investing in these resources, we are empowering students to develop leadership skills, gain real-world business experience, and achieve personal and professional growth.







CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION

This year, the Chesterfield Education Foundation raised \$500,000 to support Career and Technical Education (CTE) for the expansion of the Veterinary Science program at Monacan High School. This funding empowers students with hands-on learning opportunities and prepares them for future careers in high-demand fields. Additionally, we supported the annual CCPS College and Career Fair, providing students with valuable resources and connections to explore higher education and career pathways. Through these efforts, we are equipping students with the skills, experiences, and guidance they need to succeed in their future endeavors.



CHESTERFIELD RECOVERY ACADEMY

During the '23-'24 school year, the Chesterfield Education Foundation proudly supported **23 students** at the Chesterfield Recovery Academy, a program dedicated to helping students overcome substance abuse challenges and achieve academic success. Twelve seniors graduated, reaching an impressive **100% graduation rate**. This milestone reflects the students' resilience and the transformative impact of providing targeted support and resources to foster their growth and success.

This past year, CEF continued to support the Mirror Me teacher diversity program with stipends for 12 college students, five high school students, and 15 teacher mentors. We also provided resources for meetings and enrichment events for these deserving students and faculty, who receive support through mentoring programs and financial incentives throughout their undergraduate experience. Upon graduation, each participant will be guaranteed a teaching contract with Chesterfield County Public Schools.

Building on this momentum, we are excited to expand this impact by simplifying the application process and adding new opportunities in 2025 with a total of 21 scholarships in the new year.




