
CCPS EARLY EDUCATION SUPPORT

This year, we supplied books for both school and home libraries for 375 Pre-K students, fostering a love of reading at an early age. We supported positive behavior initiatives and hosted staff appreciation events to strengthen school communities and recognize educators' dedication. Additionally, we covered full tuition costs for before- and after-school care for 36 families, helping ensure consistent access to quality education and support. To enhance outdoor learning and play spaces, we also funded playground upgrades, including new shade structures and other improvements.

LITERACY PROGRAM GROWTH

In 2024 - 2025, CEF provided over \$50,000 in books and resources to Chesterfield students and teachers thanks to our generous donors. With your support we restocked book vending machines in elementary schools, funded the purchase of Spanish books in school libraries to support bilingual learners in low-income communities, and partnered with another nonprofit (Elevate Early Education) to host a schoolwide reading rally at Ecoff Elementary.

Marguerite Christian Elementary received new literacy carts, while Carver Academy's new drama club gained resources to spark creativity and confidence by performing *Peter Pan*. And with the second annual El Librotazo festival in July, more than 2,500 local children received brand-new books in multiple languages — opening doors to reading for all.

FIELD TRIPS & LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES

The program supported 31 students this year, offering essential academic and wellness services in a recovery-focused environment. Students achieved an impressive 89% first-time SOL pass rate, highlighting the positive effects of small-group teaching and counseling support. Throughout the year, your donations allowed CEF to encourage students with field trips, class lunches, visits from a therapy dog, and other special experiences that a PTA would normally provide. The year concluded with a meaningful completion ceremony for the students to celebrate their academic and personal success, and a statewide Recovery Schools Kickoff, where Chesterfield leads the way in recovery-focused education in Virginia.



EXPANDING TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Together we achieved a major milestone this year with the completion of a full classroom renovation to house the new Veterinary Science program at Monacan High School (previously only available at Chesterfield's two Technical Center campuses). As a result, enrollment expanded to 77 students, marking a remarkable 94% increase in available spots for those interested in careers in animal care, veterinary medicine, and agricultural sciences. This transformation was made possible through a \$500,000 grant from the Community Foundation and the dedication of the Career and Technical Education (CTE) team, whose vision and collaboration continue to create meaningful career pathways for Chesterfield's high school students.

OVER 320 HOURS OF WORK-BASED LEARNING

Together with our donors, Chesterfield Education Foundation provided over \$20,000 in annual funding to expand meaningful career and leadership opportunities for students at Meadowbrook High School's Academy for Developing Entrepreneurs. This support helped to launch two mobile kiosk carts, with 52 students gaining hands-on experience in entrepreneurship and business management. The kiosks operated at 10 school events last year, where students logged more than 320 hours of work-based learning. In addition, 25 students attended the DECA State Conference, and through CEF's collaboration with the Chesterfield County School Board, five student finalists traveled to the International DECA Competition, representing Chesterfield on a global stage.



MIRROR ME

This year, 18 students and 17 mentors participated in the program, with funding supporting a wide range of meaningful resources and opportunities. These investments made it possible to host mentor-mentee events, provide recruiting materials for college fairs and campuses at Brightpoint, VCU, and VSU, and supply notebooks and essential materials for both students and mentors. Funding also supported professional learning for mentors, staff and mentor stipends, and scholarship stipends for both college and high school students—an expansion that was new for the 2024–25 year. Looking ahead, participation is projected to grow significantly in 2025, with an anticipated 21 students and 21 mentors joining the program.



In the past year, the Foundation awarded \$35,944 in scholarships to 21 outstanding students from 9 high schools across Chesterfield County. These awards recognize academic achievement, leadership, and service, while helping students pursue their educational goals with confidence and support.

INVESTING IN EDUCATORS

Chesterfield Education Foundation supports teachers with grants, professional development opportunities, and recognition programs to foster innovation in schools.

EMPOWERING 100+ EDUCATORS

10,000+ STUDENTS SERVED

INNOVATION GRANTS

In 2025, the Foundation awarded 18 MCD Innovation Grants totaling \$75,000 across 15 schools, supporting creative and impactful classroom projects. This year saw strong interest, with double the number of applications and a 30% increase in grants awarded compared to last year. Additionally, CEF recognized outstanding initiatives through three MCD2 replication awards, enabling successful programs to expand their impact to additional classrooms and schools.







TEACHER DEVELOPMENT AND LICENSURE

The Chesterfield Education Foundation received funding from The Cameron Foundation to support the cost of certification/licensure for 27 teachers in southern Chesterfield, reimbursing their fees for classes and tests to become fully certified and endorsed classroom educators. This initiative benefits Chesterfield by supporting a pipeline of highly trained, qualified classroom educators, and unlocking higher salaries and opportunities for teachers when they attain full certification.



RECOGNITION AND APPRECIATION

CEF invests in meaningful recognition by celebrating excellence in education. From honoring outstanding alumni with the BRAVO! awards, retired educators with the Hall of Fame gala, and high school students with the Superintendent's All-County Awards, CEF ensures that impactful teaching and learning is celebrated. Additionally, by supporting new initiatives like the Participate Teachers program, classroom mini-grants, and school staff appreciation events, CEF helps educators to implement creative ideas, enrich student learning, and address critical classroom needs. Together, these investments underscore CEF's commitment to elevating and championing those who make a difference every day.






